Motion was made by Linda Hilbert and seconded by Jane Hague <u>Programs</u> (Arlan Christ): Arlan reported on programs scheduled for upcoming meetings:

December: Christmas Party – 12 Quilts of Christmas (new collection by Pat and Arlan) – plus other surprises!

January: Round Robin 3 guilts will be displayed and we will have installation of officers for 2016.

February: Chinese Auction

Announcements (Pat Christ): Pat asked that we have a round applause for the wonderful food we just enjoyed. There will be a twist to the Picnic (August Meeting) everyone will be asked to make something from the Guild Cookbook (not their own recipe). Cookbooks are still available – a good excuse to buy one. Also, Kutztown is having a celebration ending the Bicentennial year on Sunday, 20 December, 1-4 p.m. They are planning to fill a time capsule and will have other activities. Admission is free. Attendance (Gerry Glutz): 57 members and 6 guests were present for the meeting. Melissa Aiman won the drawing for a gift certificate. Gerry also reminded members that dues for 2016 are payable now - \$20 for the year.

Attendees at the January "Sit and Stitch" can help develop at pattern for sewing the blocks together.


A motion was made by Gerry Glutz, seconded by Sandy Cullen and passed by the membership to adjourn the business meeting at 7:20 p.m.

The meeting was followed by "Show and Tell" and the presentation by Pat and Arlan Christ – "The 12 Quilts of Christmas".






### Block Idea


Use this as an alternate block to create a dynamic diagonal chain across the quilt top.
