
celebration of this country is only ten years away in 2026.

**Chemotherapy Turbans** July's meeting Several members wanted the cutting directions to the chemo hats that we make in July. Here are the instructions: You'll need 3/8— 1/2 yard of fabric for two turbans, depending on the size. Cut according to the chart. Note that all sizes use the same size tab. You must stretch knit fabric and cut the pieces using the crosswise grain. You can use a sewing machine zigzag stitch but serging is simplest and quickest. The seam allowance is approximately 1/2".

Cut Size	Turban	Band	Tab	
Small	20-1/2" x 8"	20-1/2" x 5"	5" x 4"	
Medium	22" x 9"	22" x 5"	5" x 4"	
Large	24" x 10"	24" x 5"	5" x 4"

- 1. Due as a finished piece (according to your plans) in August at the meting.
- 2. Make it wall hanging size, no smaller than 24x24 or 96 inches around the perimeter, and no bigger than 36x36 or 144 inches around the perimeter.
- Must be made of fabric that is quilted any way your Creativity wants it to be. Ex: tied, grid work, hand, or any type of machine quilting.
- 4. Embellishments are encouraged!!!!I mean GREATLY Encouraged. Put your mind to work!!!!
- 5. Must be able to be hung (somehow) but a sleeve is not needed.
- Be ready at the judging to be able to talk about your inspiration to all of us, or write up a paper about it and I will read it for you.
- Do not identify the piece as yours, but after th initial judging, I want to pick out the "First time Participants" and the membership will vote for the winner/winners by doing "Woooo, woooo's as I hold them up!!!

It's SCRAP TIME again Folks! Time to use up leftovers from previous projects---clear out that Stash a bit so we can BUY MORE FABRIC!! :0)...

no affiliation ... I just like the fabric :o)


\*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*

From both dark and light calicoes you will need: two 4 1/2" squares AND four 4 7/8" squares AND two 5 1/4" squares




Start by cutting your light and dark 4 7/8" squares on the diagonal. I show one light and one dark square here; you need to cut <u>four</u> light and <u>four</u> dark squares for all different pieces within each block...


TOTALLY USE YOUR STASH




Then stack and cut two dark and two light 5 1/4" squares on the diagonal, then cut the resultant triangles on the diagonal again...



Now sew a light half square triangle to a dark. Make four of these, all different! Press seams towards darker fabric...



Next sew a dark quarter square triangle to a light. Make another pair of dark and light, and sew them together to make the center quarter square...



And piece the block, referring to the diagram at left for placement. Row 1 = half square/square/half square. Row 2 = square/quarter square/square. Row 3 = half square/square/half square, and that's it! Alternate pressing directions by square and by row...
