- 5. Must be able to be hung (somehow) but a sleeve is not needed.
- Be ready at the judging to be able to talk about your inspiration to all of us, or write up a paper about it and I will read it for you.
- 7. Do not identify the piece as yours, but after th initial judging, I want to pick out the "First time Participants" and the membership will vote for the winner/winners by doing "Woooo, woooo's as I hold them up!!!




June 8, 2016 (*Note the date change*) Quilt in a Day Pat Knoechel



50/50 Winner (Sue Wertz): Sharon Phillips won the \$46.00


