January 18, 2017 Installation of Officers at the Church

Start the New Year Off with some fun!

At the January meeting, we will welcome 2017 with the installation of new officers and a Strip Poker night! Instead of cash, buy into the game with 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips of fabric. The rules are simple, we'll play with dice and use our fabric "strips" like poker chips. Cut up some of your stash and bring strips to play that are 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches by 42 inches (or width of fabric). Lady Luck not your friend and you run out of strips? The "Bank" will have strips to purchase 5 for a dollar or spend some time in the photo area taking pictures (with props of course!) to commemorate the New Year at Guild.

Quilter's Strip Poker Rules - To begin, all players put one strip in the center of the table. Players take turns clockwise rolling the die once each turn. Roll a C - Player puts one strip in the Center of the table. Roll an L and player that rolled the dice gives 1 strip to the person on their left or roll an R and give one strip to the person on the right. Roll an X and lose a turn or roll a star and win all the strips in the center of the table. When the bell rings, move to another table.

Also, a mystery quilt challenge will be introduced for any who wish to participate.

So remember - bring lots of 2 1/2" strips, your camera or phone for photos and get ready to celebrate the New Year with lots of smiles, laughter and guilting friends!

50/50 Winner (Sue Wertz): Sandy Cullin won the \$47.50.



The Hummelstown Area Historical Society is partnering with the PieceMakers Quilt Guild of Middletown to present a special Quilt Show. Seventy five vintage and contemporary quilts will be displayed at the Society's historic 1815 Parish House at North Rosanna Street and North Alley in Hummelstown.

The Show is open from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM on five consecutive Sundays between January 29 and February 26, 2017. There is no charge for admission.

The Show, entitled Quilt 2, is a follow-up to one that the Society organized as part of Hummelstown's 250th Anniversary in 2012. Quilt 2 will feature new displays including:

- O A Then and Now display of quilts sewn in different time periods but with the same pattern.
- O Four Star of Bethlehem Quilts are featured, dating from 1880 to 1950.
- O Crib and Cradle Quilts displayed on doll and children's furniture.
- O A Quilter's Showcase features a series of 5 quilts sewn by a single quilter.
- O A WOW display of quilts which are breathtaking in design, craftsmanship, or color.
- O Vintage quilts from the Society's collection. I have included a photograph of a Broken Dishes Quilt.

This Show is not to be missed by those who enjoy sewing quilts, admiring quilts, or appreciating the history and artistry associated with quilts.
